

Marriage Amendment Vote, June 14, 2007

The Massachusetts General Court, meeting in Constitutional Convention, defeated the proposed Marriage Amendment, defining marriage as the union between one man and one woman, preventing it from going to a vote of the people at the ballot in 2008. The vote was 45 in favor, 151 opposed and three not voting (Atsalis, St. Fleur & Verga). One Senate seat is open. Fifty votes were required to put the amendment on the ballot. The following legislators, under heavy pressure to oppose the amendment, voted in favor of the people's right to vote, and should be thanked.
